



The Court:- The petitioner in this art.226 petition dated December 22, 2009 is seeking the following reliefs: a mandamus commanding the police to take steps against the miscreants; a mandamus commanding the sixth respondent, Tapan Mahapatra and his associates not to disturb the petitioner's possession of his lands; and a mandamus commanding the Block Land & Land Reforms Officer, Mahishadal to provide a Government Amin for measuring and demarcating his lands and the lands of the club.

If the sixth respondent and any member of the club committed any offence punishable under any criminal law of the land, and if the police, in spite of information, did not register an FIR, in my opinion, instead of approaching the High Court under art.226 the petitioner should have approached the Criminal Court with his complaint.

A mandamus cannot be issued directing a private party not to disturb the possession of any immovable property of another private party.

No mandamus can be issued directing the Block Land & Land Reforms Officer to provide a Government Amin for measuring and demarcating the lands of the club and the petitioner.

No law entitled the petitioner to call upon the Block Land & Land Reforms Officer to provide a Government Amin for the purpose. He could seek an order issuing a commission only in a suit instituted before the Civil Court. He is not entitled to any relief from the Writ Court.

For these reasons, the petition is dismissed. No costs. Certified xerox.
